Class Description

This is a usually a full year class but your student is welcome to join us for one or both semesters. Each semester is comprised of 8 sessions, each 2 hours long. Some classes will be held in the outside smithy shop. Dress and safety requirements will be discussed in the first class.

Syllabus /Outline

The syllabus is a general guideline. Projects, skill goals and order may be changed to better suite the skill level of a particular class, a particular student, available mediums and supplies and weather. Each student will be required to finish an individual or group project before the end of the semester for which information will be provided in the first class. Final projects will be displayed in the Gallery on our website.

SEMESTER 1: BLACKSMITHING

- 1. Pre-test; hold harmless; registration; safety; classroom rules; materials; demonstration of 18th century blacksmithing forge and anvil
- 2. S-Hook Project; round stock, square stock comparison, temp; hammer control; design; making (charcoal) fuel
- 3. Trivet Project; folding/ twist; square, pre-cut blank (Will be final project.)
- 4. Continue trivet project
- 5. Shelf Bracket Project; Recycled iron
- 6. Complete any unfinished projects
- 7. Field trip or guest speaker to be announced two weeks in advance
- 8. Post-test; Winterize smithy shop

SEMESTER 2: METAL SMITHING

- 1. Pre-test; hold harmless; registration; safety; classroom rules; materials
- 2. Wire work; chainmail and twisted wire chains
- 3. Copper work; tinkle cone; hand hammered (Will be final project)
- 4. Solder guns; basic soldering skills and solder burnout
- 5. Tin (if time) or Finish unfinished projects
- 6. Field trip or guest speaker to be announced two weeks in advance
- 7. Post test; Close up shop
