Class Description

Explore the world of 18th Century Living History Reenactment. Join Janine Frizzo, an 18th Century reenactor, merchant and tailor with 30 years experience, on a journey through time. Periods covered will include the French and Indian War and the Revolutionary War, especially as they happened here in Southwestern Michigan and Northern Indiana.

This is usually a full year class but your student is welcome to join us for one or both semesters. Each semester is comprised of 12 sessions, each 1.25 hours long.

Syllabus /Outline

The syllabus is a general guideline. Projects, skill goals and order may be changed to better suite the skill level of a particular class, a particular student, available mediums and supplies and weather. Each student will be required to finish an individual or group project before the end of the semester for which information will be provided in the first class. Semster 1

- 12. Post test. Photographs of final projects. Period games and desert .
