BLOCK ONE, Ages 11-18

The RENAISSANCE of PORTRAITURE- Drawing and Painting

Choose your group:

Group A meets TUESDAYS Sept. 17 and Oct. 1

Group B meets FRIDAYS Sept. 20 and Oct. 4

Inspired by the works of 14th-17th Century Dutch, Italian, and English "OLD MASTERS" artists

Learn basics of PORTRAITURE by studying PROPORTION, BALANCE, and SYMMETRY in figure drawing. Master portrait artists such as Leonardo DaVinci, Vermeer, Durer, Rembrandt, and more will be discussed as students create their own SELF PORTRAIT drawings and painted canvas version. Basic painting techniques will be covered as students are challenged to create a painting using only colors from the limited palette of the OLD MASTERS!

ART NOUVEAU -Design, Lettering, Drawing, and Watercolor Wash

Inspired by Scottish Architect and Designer CHARLES MACKINTOSH

The flowing lines, graceful curves and organic forms of the European ART NOUVEAU movement have inspired artists throughout the world to create buildings, interior spaces, and furniture, as well as illustration and fine art. This decorative style influenced advertising and fashion trends and elevated common objects to a level of elegance. The fluid lines of Nature bring a distinct lyrical quality to this artwork. Students will discover the prominent artists who pioneered this movement as they create a variety of graphic design and illustrative works in drawing, hand lettering, and paint.

MEDEIVAL CATHEDRALS of STONE and LIGHT

3D Art and Sculpture - Inspired by the Architecture and Design of the Middle Ages

The Castles and Cathedrals of MEDEIVAL ARCHITECTURE bring to mind rough textures of stone, smooth textures of glass and glazed clay mosaic, slivers of light and color, and dark spaces with damp earth. For centuries ancient structures have attracted visitors to European shores and continue to be a Hallmark of Western Civilization. A variety of ancient cathedrals, structures and dwellings will inspire students to create their own 3-D "Planar" sculpture. In addition to paper and board, Glass and other translucent materials will be explored as a means of capturing light and color in architectural and interior Design models.

Art of the SURREAL - Collage and Drawing in Color

Group B meets FRIDAYS Jan. 24 and Feb. 7

Inspired by SURREALISM and the works of SALVADOR DALI

Students will explore their own imagination as they discover the whimsy and fantastical worlds of SURREALISM. An art movement which challenged traditional art standards, the Surrealists focused on dreams, thoughts, and interpretations of time, life, fear, and many other human emotions. Students will discuss the importance of PROPORTION as a means of conveying visual space and depth, as they create a variety of collaged compositions which will serve as reference for colored drawings and paintings.

BLOCK FIVE, Ages 11-18

Le CIRQUE - Wire, Clay, and Illumination in SCULPTURE

Choose your group:

Group A meets TUESDAYS Feb. 18 and March 3

Group B meets FRIDAYS Feb. 21 and March 6

Inspired by Circus Imagery and the Art of Georges Seurat, Edgar Degas, Henri De Toulouse-Lautrec

Sweeping colors of light, exciting rhythms, bold patterns, MOVEMENT, and SOUND... The CIRCUS arena is a culmination of self-expression, performance, and DESIGN which inspired many of Europe's finest artists to create expressive works of their own! Students will be challenged to create articulated sculpture with a variety of materials, as they learn about the techniques and styles of Seurat, Degas, and Toulouse-Lautrec. TEXTURE, PATTERN, and MOVEMENT will be emphasized.

CUBISM - Musical marks in Mixed Media

Choose your group:

Group A meets TUESDAYS March 17 and March 31

Group B meets FRIDAYS March 20 and April 3

Inspired by the CUBISM and the art of PABLO PICASSO

Pablo Picasso was fascinated by MUSIC and the INSTRUMENTS that created a variety of dramatic moods and tones. Drawing from life, Musical instruments will provide inspiration for this creative approach to capturing 3D forms on 2D surfaces. Students will create a variety of sketches and drawings, then incorporate collage materials such as vintage sheet music to make composed works of art. Students will explore the creative aspects of CUBISM and the Design Principles of ABSTRACT ART as they are challenged to see forms from multiple points of view.

Found Object Sculpture and Illustration

Inspired by the Dada Movement, DESIGN and late 20th century Interpretations

The 20th century affected the Art World in many ways, but most profoundly it changed the way people define art.

Contemporary art tells a story, communicates a message, or conveys an idea. Art in the early 21st century is defined by CONCEPT as well as Technique and Form. Students will discuss what ART means in our world today and the many careers available for artists, designers, and creative thinkers. Students will experiment with a variety of techniques and materials as they learn how to become ‘Creative Thinkers’, by developing a conceptual “narrative” through a series of artistic projects.
