COURSE DESCRIPTION (OVERVIEW):

Over the course of the semester, students will learn to create compelling, interesting and unique imagery using recycled print matter and other found materials, with styles ranging from the abstract to photorealistic.

Artists of any age and skill level can become proficient in the techniques involved, so collage-making is a great alternative for those aspiring artists who either aren't proficient or interested in traditional painting and drawing. Yet it is also a good way for more experienced artists to expand their range of skills or get out of a rut.

In addition to the finished pieces, successful students will leave

class with a mastery of the value scale, a keen eye for detail, and

fuller appreciation for a satisfying and effective artistic medium that is all too often overlooked.

Classes meet weekly at the instructor's home studio outside of Eau Claire, from January to March.

*Family or friend groups with 3 or more students may make arrangements with the instructor for alternate locations, such as at-home class sessions.

SYLLABUS/OUTLINE: WEEKLY BREAKDOWN OF PROJECT-BASED LEARNING LAB ACTIVITIES

During our first class period, students will become familiar with the tools, materials and techniques used to create a collage through a series of exercises.

The remaining class periods will be spent planning and working to complete the student's original compositions. The amount of time spent on individual pieces will vary, depending on their scale and complexity.
